

Focus and Methods

For this issue, the *CRJ* will publish **decision-focused cases based on secondary sourced data (e.g., data from published sources)**. Preference will be given to cases where the protagonist and organization are named, rather than disguised, but disguised cases will be considered where the case scenario and/or issue warrant. Note: sensitive information, such as financial data, may be disguised to protect an individual's or organization's competitive position. Authors who intend to disguise information are encouraged to consult the Editor.

Methods: Legal proceedings and / or congressional testimony and / or an extensive list of diverse sources (which could include journalists accounts, website content, industry reports). Typically cases relying **only** on journalist accounts or website content will not be considered appropriate.

CRJ does not publish fictionalized, composite, or hypothetical cases.
